Rothstein Educational Scholarship Deadline Extended

The Village Council is now considering applications for grants under the Robert & Sylvia Rothstein Educational Scholarship. The scholarship was established by the Council in 1998 and is funded by the Village of Friendship Heights and private donations (all donations to the Rothstein Scholarship fund are tax deductible).

This is a merit scholarship of up to \$10,000. It is not based on financial need. Residency in the Village of Friendship Heights is required. The scholarship is open to residents of **all** ages who are enrolled or plan to enroll in a post-secondary academic program in 2004 to 2005.

Update on Hecht's Development

New England Development is scheduled to begin construction on the Hecht's project in early August.

The first phase will be the relocation of utility lines at the corner of Western Avenue and Friendship Boulevard, in preparation for the construction of the new Hecht's store. The existing Hecht's store will remain open until the new one is built. The project will include a high-rise residential building, office, retail (including a new Whole Foods store), community center, and public park. Construction is expected to take about 42 months.

Utility Undergrounding Project Moves Forward

We have continued working with Pepco to remove the remaining overhead utility lines and poles along South Park Avenue and The

Hills Plaza. Our contractor has completed the installation of conduit in The Hills Plaza. The rest of the underground conduit will be connected by Pepco through existing lines in South Park out to Wisconsin Avenue. Once the underground work is complete, Pepco will remove the overhead system.
