## Village Council Meeting

December 8, 2025

### Recorded Votes

1. Chairwoman Solt moved to reinstall the pergola with all code and engineering requirements for an estimated cost of \$49,000. Councilmember Muller seconded the motion. All Councilmembers voted against the motion.
2. Chairwoman Solt moved to adopt option 2, removing the pergola permanently and replacing it with vegetation and a fence for an estimated cost of \$20,000 - \$25,000. Councilmember Muller seconded the motion. All Councilmembers voted against the motion except for Councilmember Muller who abstained.
3. Chairwoman Solt moved to adopt option 3, removing the pergola permanently and replacing it with vegetation after a safety review is completed by the project manager for an estimated cost of \$10,000 - \$15,000. Councilmember Klein seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
4. Councilmember Conlow moved to adopt the proposal from The Traffic Group for a single-phase study totaling \$83,500 submitted in response to the Village's RFP for a pedestrian safety study. Chairwoman Solt seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
5. Chairwoman Solt moved to adopt the proposal from Electrical Connections for an ADA compliant charging station for \$25,780. Councilmember Klein seconded the motion. All Councilmembers voted for the motion except for Councilmember Muller who abstained.
6. Councilmember Klein moved to approve the issuance by the mayor of a letter to the Montgomery County Library Board in support of a public library and performing arts center in the revised Friendship Heights sector plan. Councilmember Muller seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

7. Councilmember Klein moved to approve the issuance by the mayor of a letter to the Montgomery County Planning Department explain the Villages concerns with development of parcel 6.
8. Mayor Schaeffer moved to nominate Michael Cooperman to serve on the Advisory Committee on Development. The motion passed unanimously.
